A REPORT ON THE 2012 ALL AMERICAN RAILROAD SHOW

The Division had another successful All American Railroad Show this past March and was able to generate a grand total profit to the Division of \$1,801.18. In comparison, our three previous years generated profits

of \$1,866.13 in 2011, \$1,812.94 in 2010, and \$3,118.78 in 2009. The 2009 profit is a bit skewed because the Division also ran the concessions that year and added that profit of \$798.91 to the bottom line.

Our net gate (the take at the door after the money used to make change is deducted) was \$4,756.00 compared with \$5,645.75 in 2011, \$5,761.00 in 2010 and \$6,827.00 in 2009. Attendance at this year's show was down a bit as evidenced by the numbers, but a survey of the door prize registrations indicate we still draw from several outlying cities and towns and even a few from out of state.

Total expenses, which includes postage, office supplies, printing, advertising, coffee, donuts and lunches, came to \$1,915.09 compared with \$2,082.75 in 2011, \$2,400.76 in 2010 and \$2,261.07 in 2009. Expenses across the board can be expected to increase year to year with the biggest variance resulting from the number of lunches the Division provides to the exhibitors, but sometimes leftover office supplies from the previous year can be used and the total costs are offset somewhat.

Our contractual 50/50 split arrangement with the school resulted in a payment to the school of \$1,724.94 compared with \$1,781.50 in 2011, \$1,680.12 in 2010 and \$2,282.96 in 2009. A donation jar set out for coffee, donuts and lunches netted the Division an additional \$76.25 and a profit of \$304.84 from the concessions brought the Division's total profit to \$1,801.18.

The Division ran the concession for the first time in a few years, with the blessings of the school who even donated several cases of pop left over from their basketball season.

A big, big, thank you, to my wonderful wife Mary who took complete charge of the concessions and did a terrific job.

Our Division again had a table at the show and I need to send a heartfelt thank you to those who staffed it throughout the day. Kalmbach Publishing graciously donated three one-year subscriptions to *Model Railroader* magazine and the fine folks at the Illinois Railway Museum donated four family day passes to the museum. Our own Superintendent, Keith Lipske of Timberline Train Shop in Downers Grove again donated a train set. All eight prizes were awarded at the end of the day.

I need to send a sincere thank you to all the individuals who stepped up on the day of the show to collect money, stamp hands, count money, distribute lunches and do any number of other small tasks that I called upon them to do. Your willingness to help is very much appreciated.

I hope to have a date soon for the 2013 show and will again look to persuade the school to allow us to run the concessions.

And finally, if anyone in the Division knows of an individual or group who would like to exhibit at the show, please put me in touch with them. My goal has always been to put on the best show we can and one the public looks forward to and comes back to year after year.

FROM THE BACK OF THE ROUNDHOUSE - Building the Railroad in Sections: The Perfect End Game

For this clinic, "perfect" is obviously misleading as the only perfect thing in model railroading is the (my) First Law: "Anything installed and meant to be permanent will at some time have to be


relocated, rebuilt or re-something'd." That modular groups allow for moving things around is a good start. The prime advantage of a home layout built in sections; it can be moved when necessary. It also observes Dave Barry's rule: "Everything becomes portable as soon as it is carried."

Designing your layout in sections presents endless possibilities, each with their own set of surprises. Just a few basics gleaned from experience (mine and others) gets us started; at the far end of the next section to be built. So, follow the illustration shown below, for some ideas on sectional building.

This is one end of any section that you need. I call this the "D" end. It is the end section farthest from the central source of all wiring....have to start somewhere. Its mate on the next section is the "P" end. Both are 1"x3" and can also be 1"x2". The length should not exceed 24-30", else it all gets too wide (violating the "2-foot rule") and too heavy. A notch of 1"x 3/4" on each end is cut for attaching the section stringers which can nominally up to four feet in length. One or both notches can be flipped, (1) & (2).

Parts (A) are 1"x2" or 1"x3" blocks with a length of 2 inches that are cleats to hold one section level with the next especially when taking things apart. I agree with the experts who recommend that connector bolts be used for section alignment or load bearing. The cleats also help protect wiring between the sections. Part (B) is the inner side of the board and can be used to place terminal strips for wires and maybe a DCC booster. Part (C) has two holes (drilled 1/4") for 1/4" diameter carriage bolts that are 2 inches in length. Corresponding T-nuts are worked into the "D" end on the backside (end of the next section, which has no cleats). For less error two end boards are first clamped together to make a matched pair. Make sure that the cleats are correct, the top edges match and the bolt holes also line up. When not in use the bolts can be threaded

backwards through the T-nuts so that they do not get lost. Be sure to include the correct washers for the bolts.



For Part (E) it is very important to keep the subroadbed from sagging (I use 1/4" plywood a lot). An extra cleat is added at track level using wood glue and screws as this is structural for level track. Cut 1"x1" or 1"x2" to the required length. Part (V) is the vertical support for any upper level tracks and is usually 1"x2" or 1"x3". The top 1"x2" has its partner on the next section correctly matched at the same time. Any number of these may be needed at different elevations. Screws that are no. 8 x 1-1/2" multi-purpose, flat head Phillips screws should be used.

These parts need to be built ahead of the installation date so the glue can dry fully. What glue? We all share the worst kept secret about wood; it splits. So to mitigate this problem, wet each end of the piece of

cut wood using a mist sprayer with a drop of dish soap. Now, work some glue into the end and let it dry. At the next session, the glue can be sanded and will now hold the screw forever, no split ends, no extra hard work or worry. The glue adds strength and is also a moisture block.

The additional technique is important because I get to quote John Ostler (NMRA Scale Rails, Aug 2004, pg 26): "The things I do (in his example, to produce a detailed HO freight car) resemble ART more than shop work." Railroads themselves are the near perfect expression of art. They have both motion and purpose and so do we railroad modelers. The joy of the hobby and the skills to get and keep trains running.
