Mid West Region Board approves Region Dues

A major topic of discussion over the last 20+ years has been the necessity of having Region dues. The Region has completely depended on the shared profits from the Region conventions to finance all of the Region services provided to the Divisions and individual Region members. The lack of any services being provided by the Region is the result of not having enough money to provide those activities. By not enough, I'm talking about a bare bones budget of printing 2 small issues of the WAYBILL, and some incidental expenses. No one can predict how successful our conventions will be, or if they will show any profit at all.

Over the last year, the topic of finding another means of generating funding has been requested and limited responses were received from some Region members. Almost all of the ideas presented had merit, but also included added costs of requiring many, many more volunteers and a lot of dedicated time. Something few of us have.

Almost all of the other Regions in the NMRA have a dues program. The only other Region not having a dues program is Mid Central Region: Ohio, Eastern Indiana. The Rocky Mountain Division has just voted to remove dues, but they have a Region bank account with over \$70,000.00 in it.

The BOD of the Mid West Region has struggled to find other means to provide financial support, and a dues program has been the only viable direction. I, for one, did not and do not want dues. But, without any practical options, there is no other choice.

At the July 11, 1998, Mid West Region Board of Directors Meeting, a program of Region dues, its structure and scheduling was adopted.

A serious concern by the BOD was the future performance of the Region in response to services provided to the Region Members. The following is the adopted BY-LAW accepted by the Board:

REGION DUES

Continued from Page 1

ARTICLE VIII - MEMBERSHIP

1. There shall be four classes of Region membership for which the payment of dues is required as follows:
 - A. Regular Membership: the annual dues for Regular Members shall be \$6.00, payable in U. S. funds.
 - B. Life Membership: Life Membership shall be based on the same actuarial tables used to determine National NMRA Life dues.
 - C. Family Membership: The annual dues for a family Member shall be one half (1/2) those of a regular member rounded to the nearest dollar.
 - D. Youth Membership: There shall be not dues charged for a Youth membership.
2. Eligibility for Membership classes shall be as follows:
 - A. Any member in good standing of the NMRA shall be eligible for Regular Membership.
 - B. Any Life Member of the NMRA shall be eligible for Life Membership in the Region.
 - C. Any Family Member of the NMRA shall be eligible for Family Membership, provided that the sponsoring member is a member in good standing of the Mid West Region. In addition, any affiliate Member of the NMRA who is otherwise eligible for National Family Membership shall be eligible for Family Membership in the Mid West Region.
 - D. Any Youth Member of the NMRA shall be eligible for Youth Membership.
3. All membership, except Family Memberships, shall include a subscription to the Region publication.
4. Family Memberships are entitled to participation in all activities of the Region, but shall not be eligible to vote or to hold office.
5. Membership terms shall coincide with the Member's National membership.
6. This article shall be effective January 1, 1999, and will terminate on December 31, 2003, unless modified or extended by action of the BOD.

The BOD is hopeful that this direction is of minimal expense to everyone in the Region, and that all NMRA members residing within the Region will support the Region by becoming Region members.

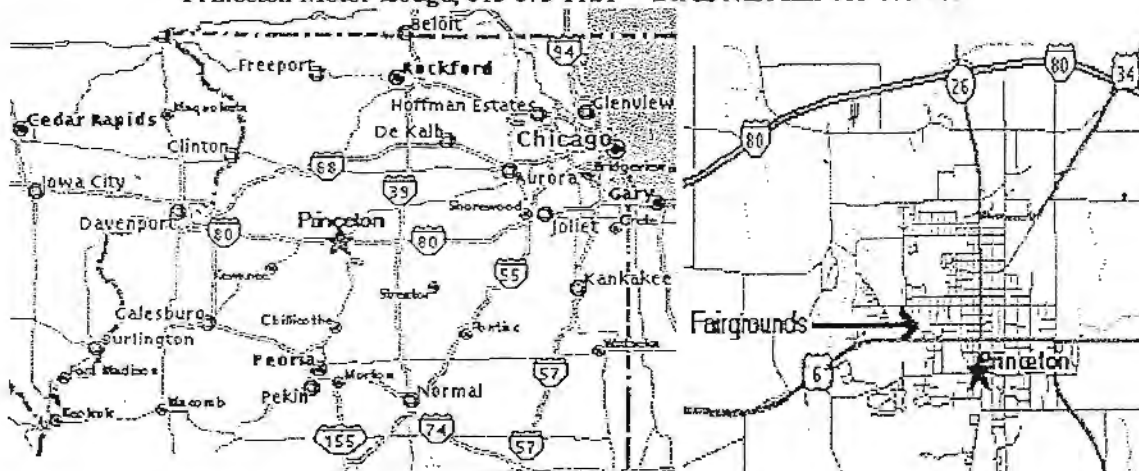

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This issue of the WAYBILL is quite unusual in that the entire issue was put together by me. We anticipate a new WAYBILL EDITOR will be selected very soon. What I've tried to do is set the basic standard of what the WAYBILL will contain, and how it will be presented. This is the first step toward strengthening the services from the Region to the individual Region members. The past many years have shown a vast reduction of Region services due to lack of funds. On July 11, 1998, the Region BOD have approved a program of Region Dues, explained elsewhere in this issue. The result of that decision is to make the committed improvements. It is up to the BOD to follow through with everything promised for improvement of the Region services. Many of these commitments have been identified in previous WAYBILLS and if you have any questions relating to points, please contact me or someone from the Region. There is no information that will be withheld from any one.

We are asking for your support by joining the Mid West Region and becoming a Region Member. The program we are pursuing will provide improvements in services, information, and activities. We will promote Region and Division activities to the entire Region membership. No just what's going on in your immediate area, but all over the Region. We will also put in place better programs for new members, as well as try to identify why members do not renew membership. This will help direct all of our activities in the future. If we are not doing something right, fix it! Your input is important to us and the Region. The Region is here to serve you as a member, not to tell you what you deserve.

The entire BOD supports the direction set for the Region. We have between 2767 to 2857 NMRA members within the Region and it is our goal to earn the support for all of them to join the Region. This may, or may not, be achievable but why not try. The MWR has the most NMRA members of all 16 Regions, but we provide the least in services. That will change.

By a better coordination of the various Division activities, an important start is being made. This issue is a little short on Division activities because of a short time cycle from the last BOD meeting and the timely issuance of the WAYBILL to have it in your hands before the Fall season starts. Usually the first issue of the year has been in October. The IVD Fall Meet, "Gandy Dancer's," in Princeton, IL, on September 18-20 required the initial change in publishing. This also gave us the opportunity to begin listing all of the various Division programs.

The "Gandy Dancer's" plans to be a very interesting Meet. Many of the usual activities held in conjunction with our regular conventions will be changed for this one. The banquet will be a Pig Roast, and not just Pig. Other meats will be available. We will have a silent auction only due to the regulations of the County Fairgrounds. Some excellent clinics are planned, and prototype activities are planned. A good non-rail program is included. If you haven't been to a Region convention before, or if it has been many years, please come to "Gandy Dancer's". I plan to see you there!

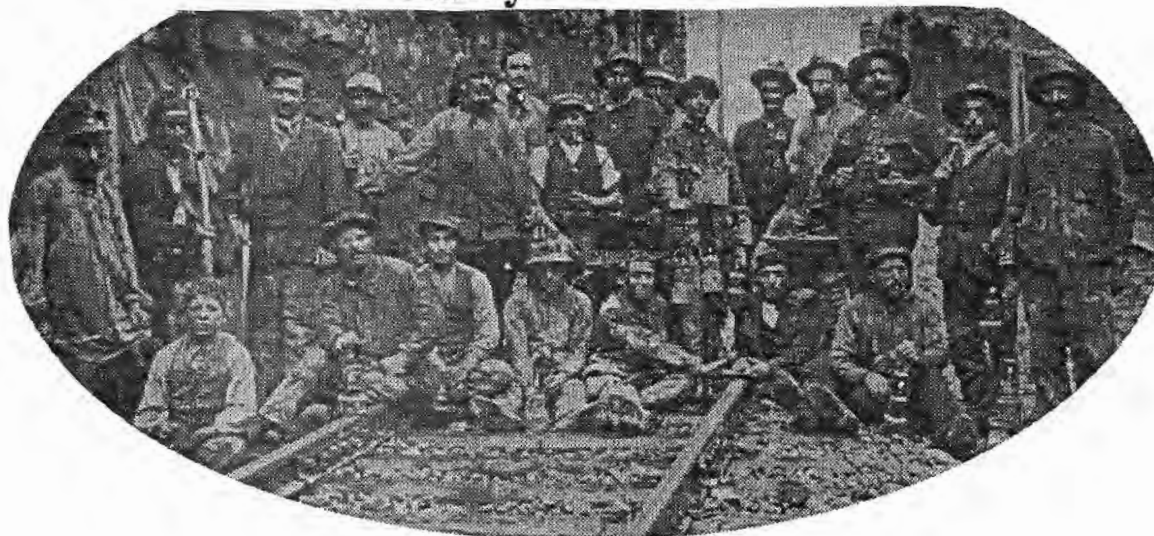
